Jennifer's civic engagement includes service on the board of Consolidated Community School District 21 and leadership roles with the Asian Giving Circle, Illinois Caucus for Adolescent Health, Japanese American Service Committee, and Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in Philanthropy.
